<b>Foundation Subjects (A)</b> Platform  Common Subjects (5 credits)	“Special Lecture on Multicultural Societies” <sup>d</sup> <b>(Cross-cultural Talk)</b>	<b>M1~D3</b> One credit per each academic year. <b>(Total 5 credits)</b>	The course aims to address common problems/challenges in Asia through multicultural awareness, and a deep understanding of cross-cultural coexistence as a disciplinary basis. <i>(Annual Compulsory Course)</i>

Student will learn interdisciplinary concept including a wide range of skills in literacy development through cross-cultural understanding. Within the six subjects, student needs to take a minimum of three subjects including the courses from his/her own department and Graduate School of International Development (GSID). A student from GSID needs to take a minimum of one subject from other Graduate Schools.
<b>Foundation Subjects (C)</b> Platform  Compulsory subjects (4 Credits)	<b>1. International Development and Cooperation Course<sup>a</sup></b> Subject: Multi-Ethnic Society, Poverty and Social Policy, Development and Socio-Cultural Change, Rural Economics, Development and Business, Indigenous Development and Capacity Building in Rural Area, Educational Development Policies, Educational Development Cooperation and Partnership, Education and Wellbeing <b>2. International Society and Culture Course<sup>b</sup></b> Subjects: Seminar on Social Psychology I, Seminar on Adult and Lifelong Education IV <b>3. Healthcare Administration course</b> Subjects (e.g.) Molecular Pathology, Introduction to Clinical Medicine <b>4. Health Science course<sup>c</sup></b> Subjects: (e.g.): Bioethics Introduction to Healthcare system in Asia, Introduction to Consultation, Introduction to Management of Medical Services, etc <b>5. Bioagricultural Course</b> Subject: (e.g.) Enzymology 1, Nutritional Biochemistry, Biomolecular Engineering, Forest Environment Science, Forest Biology, Forest Sociology, etc	<b>M1~M2</b>  <b>(Total 4 credits)</b>	Student will be introduced to his/her own specialized subject and at the same time, would acquire a wide range of skills in literacy development that is the foundation in the research area of Well-being. This would help deepen their understanding of the multicultural society of Asia. It is mandatory for you to take 2 subjects.

Student needs to take the total of four credits within five years program.	The world-class woman leaders from international organizations, JICA, policy-making institutions, and global enterprises will give a series of special guest lectures.  Student needs to take a minimum of three subjects including two subjects from Special Lecture on International Development (Global Leader I~IV) series.
<b>English Language Course</b> (4 credits)	<b>Research Skills A-1, A-2, B-1, B-2, B-3, B-4, C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4, C-5, C-6, D-1</b> <b>English Communication in Environmental Issues</b>	<b>M1~M2</b>  One credit per each academic year.  <b>(Total 4 credits)</b>	The intensive English course has been tailored to suit student’s individual needs of essential language skills. This course will help students to express his/her own idea/opinion in the global arena. Moreover, this course will focus on academic writing and necessary English language skills needed to work at the global arena.  You do not have to take the subjects if your iBTscore is 85 or more
<b>Practical subject/Field trip</b>  (Compulsory subject)  (7 credits)	<b>Overseas Training Program 1<sup>d</sup></b> <b>Overseas Training Program 2<sup>d</sup></b>  <b>Well-being’s internship/ training programs (optional)<sup>d</sup></b>  <b>Overseas Training Program Seminar 1<sup>d</sup></b> <b>Overseas Training Program Seminar 2<sup>d</sup></b>	<b>M1~D3</b> <b>M1~ M2</b>  Four or more credits.  <b>(Total 7 credits)</b>	An interdisciplinary team, which includes five students from four Graduate Schools, will be formed. The team will deal with various issues academically during the overseas joint training. Language and cultural lecture will be given before overseas training.  Its mandatory for you to take “Overseas Training Program Seminar " before going to " Overseas Training Program”.
<b>Doctoral dissertation</b>  (6 credits)	<b>Doctoral dissertation research project</b>	D1~D3  <b>(Total 6 credits)</b>	Three faculty members including faculty members from other Graduate Schools will fully support student to complete a doctoral dissertation research project to earn a Doctoral degree.
